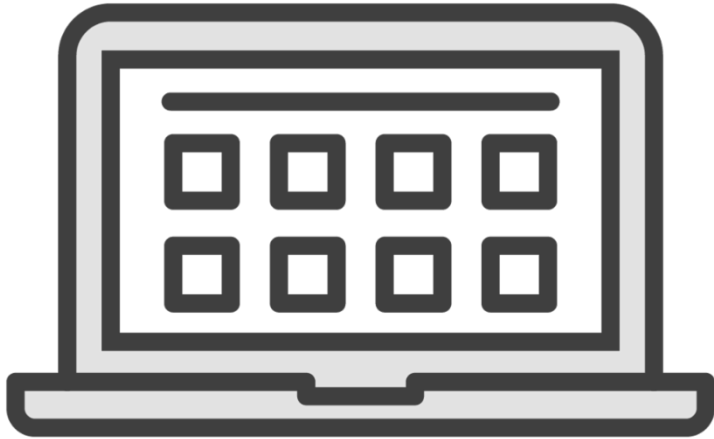

Central location to store and manage assets for all your users to use

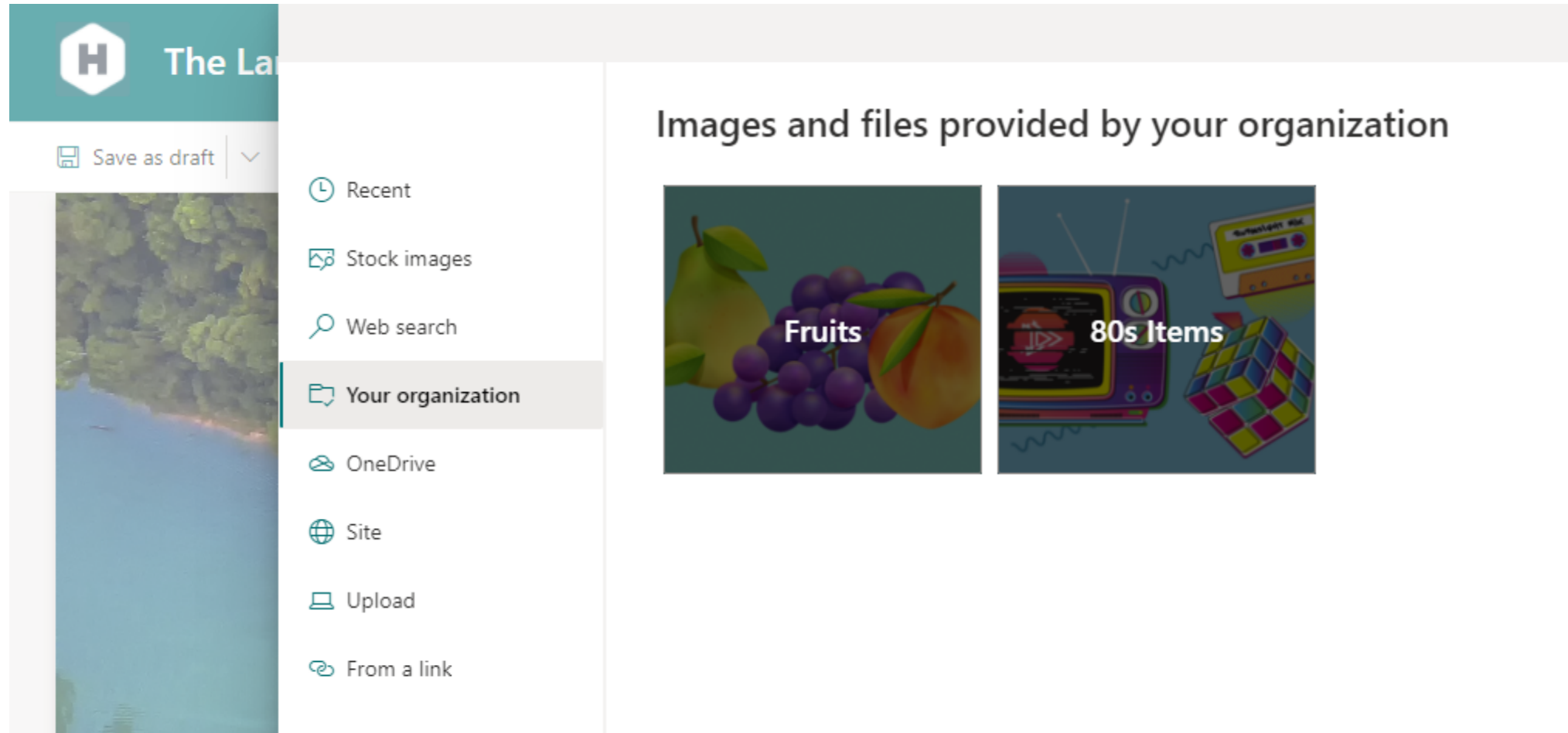
Images

- Photos and logos

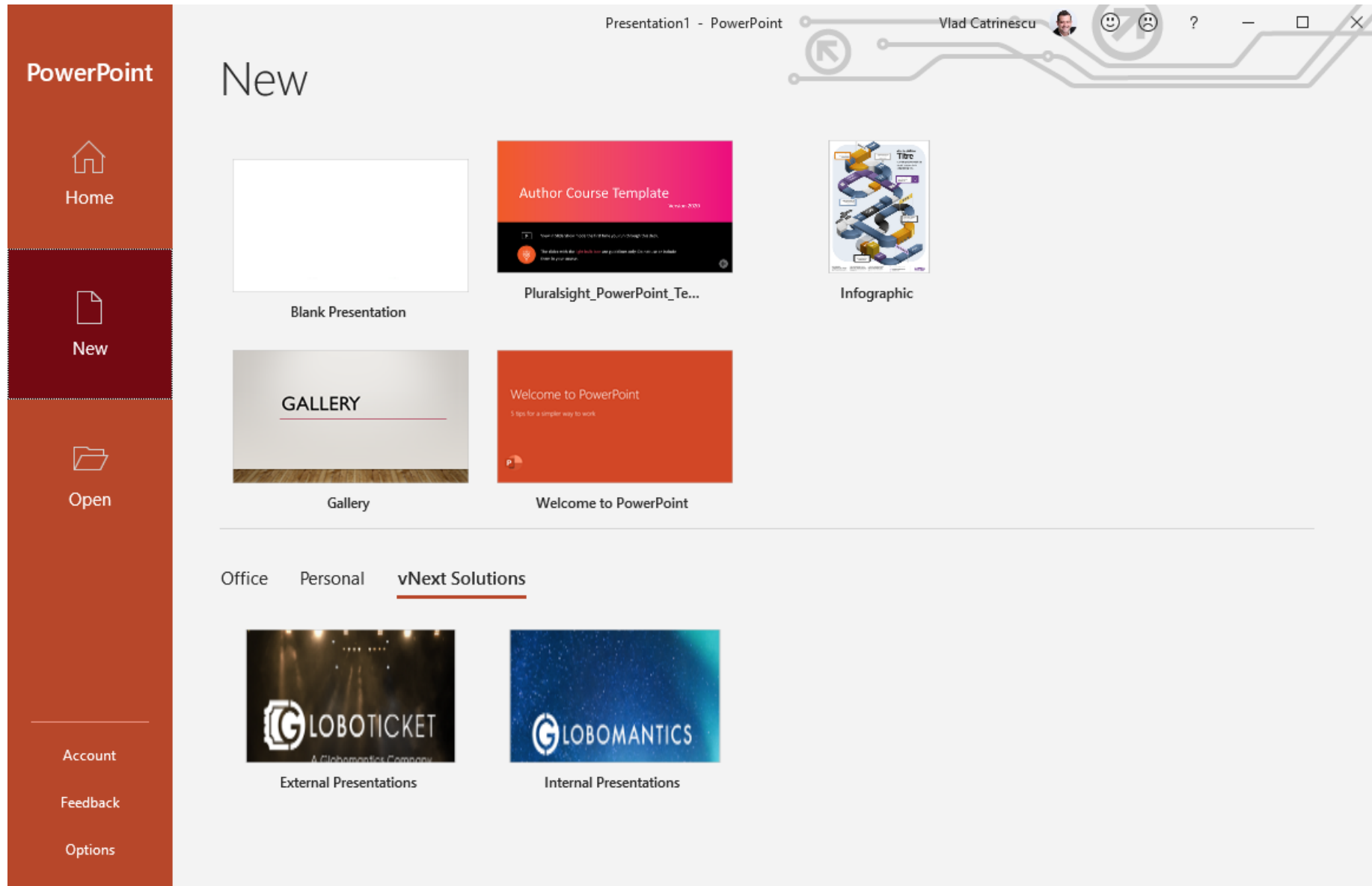
Office Templates

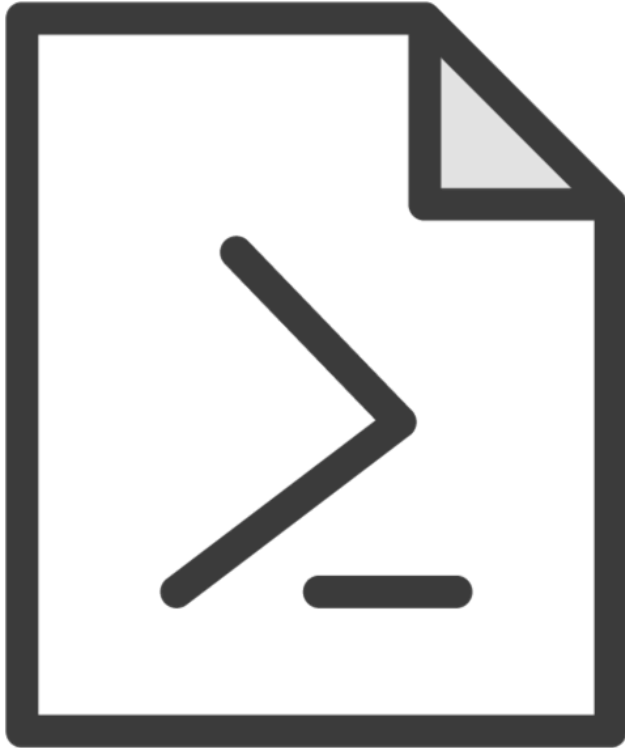

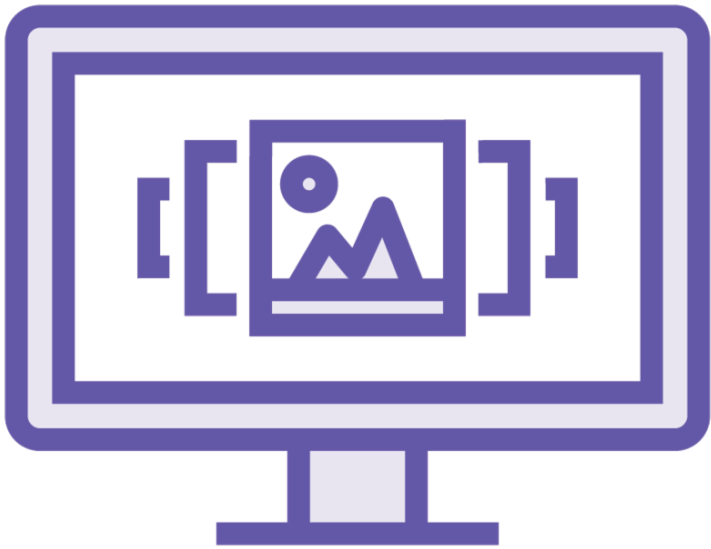
Creating an Organization Assets Library



Creating and managing an organization assets library can only be done via PowerShell



One or Many Libraries



You can have multiple Image libraries and multiple Office libraries

- Maximum 30 in total
- All must be on same site

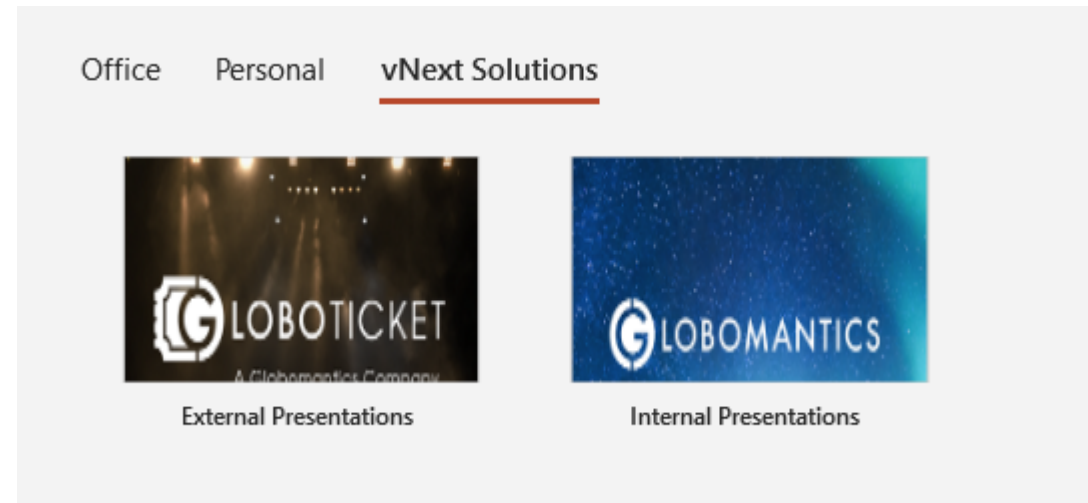
Each library is a document library inside a SharePoint site

- New or existing site

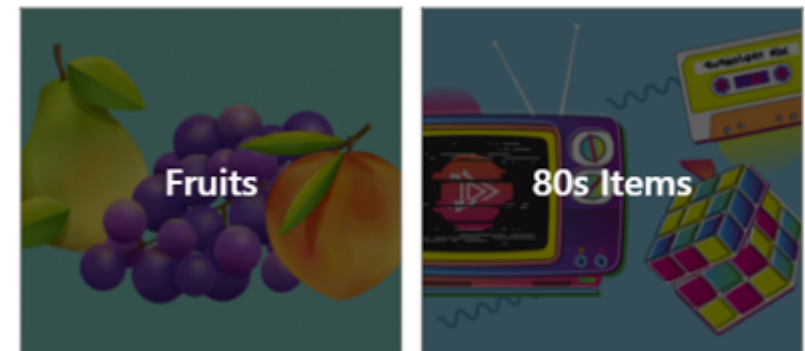


Each library has a thumbnail image

Makes it easy to recognize its contents



Images and files provided by your organization



Office 365 Content Delivery Network (CDN)



Adding an organization asset library will enable CDN for your organization

You can decide whether you want to use the public or private CDN for each library



Adding an Organization Asset Library

Add-SP00rgAssetsLibrary `  
  -LibraryURL <Library URL> `  
  -ThumbnailURL<Thumbnail URL> `  
  -OrgAssetType <ImageDocumentLibrary or OfficeTemplateLibrary> `  
  -CdnType <Public or Private>
```
